22.03.44	Planning Matters:						
	Application number PL/2022/01378. The Holt, Holt Lane, Teffont Evias. SP3 5RG						
	The applicant, Councillor Blamey, was invited by the Chair to summarise the building works planned.						
	Councillor Blamey explained the works constituted two parts. The first works on the garden side, are to replace the existing softwood windows and doors with more thermally efficient hardwood windows and doors and would be like for like, excluding one of the doors.						
	The second works are internal and are designed to expand an archway by half a metre either side.						
	The applicant explained that whilst no formal pre planning application had been made, the plan had been explained to the Case officer who, informally, expressed an opinion that he could not see any issues.						
	In summary, Teffont Parish Council were satisfied with the Case Officers opinion and were willing to support the application.						
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22.03.88 Capital Investment Plan Review.

Councillor Johnson informed the Council the intention is to have the bus shelters re ridged and the damaged timber planks replaced by the end of May 2022, in readiness for the jubilee celebrations. Councillor Johnson will then update the CIP to reflect the works done.

Over the next three months quotes will be obtained for the refurbishment of the Village border stones. Advice is being taken for their restoration. Councillor Johnson will then report his findings to the Parish Council and submit his quotes. He hopes the Parish Council will have sufficient funds to meet the cost but will seek financial support from the Teffont Trust if the PC is unable to meet the cost.

The three noticeboards in the Village require re varnishing and quotes are being sought.

Councillor Fisher has some knowledge of the history and location of the stones and will work with Councillor Johnson to provide the best outcome.

22.03.99 Platinum Jubilee Party Funding.

Councillor Johnson and Mr Andrew Chapman are seeking funding to support the Village Platinum Jubilee Party.

Councillor Johnson informed the Council of the agenda for the party. He informed the Council that Teffont Village Hall Committee have pledged to donate £500 and so have the Teffont Village Show Committee. The Platinum Jubilee Committee request a donation from the Parish Council for £500.

The Clerk discussed the donation with Councillor Johnson and the optimal fund to support this donation is the grass cutting reserve fund which holds £500 that has not been required this year.

The Clerk verified for the Parish Council the account holding the £500 grass cutting fund.

The Chair asked for comments from the Councillors.

The Councillors support the motion.

22.03.100 Blocked Drains on The Street, B3089.

Councillor Blamey has reviewed his correspondence with Wiltshire Council on this matter and confirms that it is on the list for investigation but, to date, no investigations by Wiltshire Council have taken place.

Teffont Parish Council are satisfied the drain belongs to Wiltshire Council, following their own investigation.

Councillor Blamey will formulate a strongly worded letter for the Parish Clerk to forward to David Button at Wiltshire Council, Highways department, highlighting the health and safety issues caused by the flooding of the drain. Parish Clerk to forward the letter to the Chair.

22.03.101 Highways Subcommittee update.

The Clerk had received no response to a report requesting a full investigation into traffic issues on the C24 sent to Paul Shaddock. The Clerk will resubmit the report to Paul Shaddock at Highways. Councillors Blamey, Deane and Graham will continue to prioritise the issues regarding the C24.
